Student term one reports are currently being prepared by RBS staff and will be distributed to parents on Thursday, 13th of December.

The report formats are new and different from report formats parents are typically used to in Abu Dhabi. Our new reports are extremely detailed and provide parents with a range of information, including work habits and attendance. The reports also include subject comments and judgements.

The reports outline your child's achievements as well as next steps for their development. As a complimenting document regarding your child's learning, it is essential you read it as a positive statement and not to look at the report as a plan for tutoring over the holiday break. Reports are a measure of your child's performance during a particular reporting period and should not be taken as a complete predictor of their full potential or ability. As children mature their ability to accept new knowledge increases and what was confusing three months ago is now understood clearly.


The importance of study and support can never be underestimated; when done in the right way it will enable your child to achieve grades higher than they would have if you did not support them.

We understand that many parents will want to talk to teachers as soon as the reports are issued. However please take the time to read the report carefully with your child and talk about what the teacher has mentioned. The start of the new school term will then provide you with the opportunity to discuss the report in more detail and come to a mutual understanding with the class teacher on what the focus of the term will be.

Staff have ensured that the results and information provided is based on clear evidence collected throughout the term. Our reports are open, honest and transparent and provide parents with a snapshot of where their child is at this early stage of the year.

Secondary School


Year 7 students carried out practical work and investigations during their Physics topic 'Energy'. They compared the amounts of energy stored in different foods.

Year 8 students carried out several practical experiments and investigations during their Physics topic 'Fluids'. They tested different solids and liquids to find their density and measured the temperature of a liquid as it cools down and turns into a solid.

Year 9 students carried out practical investigations during their topic 'Forces and Motion'; they measured the force and speed of travelling objects.

Year 10 & 11

Students started Unit 1 'Principles of Chemistry'. They looked at different oxides from the Periodic Table of Elements and determined their pH value using universal indicator.







End of Term Exams:

Our Key Stage 3 and 4 students will start with their end of term exams on the 4th of December 2018. The exam schedule and topic lists should be used by all students in order to be well prepared and ready for the exams. This was shared with all parents on the Engage Parent Portal and on Class Dojo on the 15th of November.










Year 4 enjoyed a trip to Bounce Abu Dhabi Trampoline Park.
