Reach

As you are aware, the Holy Month of Ramadan is due to start this week. Ramadan is the ninth month in the Islamic calendar and is a period of prayer, self-control, charity and goodwill to others. For our Muslim and non-Muslim students, this is an ideal opportunity for them to think about self-discipline and consideration of other people.

We want all our students at Reach British School to learn about this special month and to take advantage of the aspects of selfimprovement that are associated with it. To enable our Muslim students to take full part in fasting and the other spiritual experiences, we have set out some special activities during Ramadan:



On Wednesday and Thursday, 1-2 May, we held a special Ramadan celebration for all students, organized by the Arabic and Islamic teachers, to celebrate the occasion.

As Ramadan coincides with midsummer this year, we understand that the combination of long days, higher temperatures, as well as on-going school assessments will put extra pressure on our students. Following guidelines from the ADEK, we are required to reduce the school hours during the Holy Month of Ramadan, starting at 08.30 and finishing at 13.30. The reduced hours will help students have enough time to rest and have plenty of time to revise and study. If your son/daughter is fasting, please make sure to choose a well-balanced diet and keep them hydrated. It helps, of course, for children to get as much sleep as they can during this time.

Attendance during this period is as important as at any other time of the year. Students need to be in school to learn. Senior students studying IGCSE need to continue to study over the whole of the two-year course, and students in lower years are preparing for subject assessments that are timetabled throughout the term up until the last week. All of these will feed into their Term 3 report. We respectfully ask you to make sure that your son/daughter continues to come to school on time every day during Ramadan.

Thank you for your support, which is always greatly appreciated. May you and your family have a Ramadan filled with peace and serenity.

The second part of the workshop involved the students using their entrepreneurial skills to set up a stall in the marketplace. The students traded items for stall supplies and then 'sold' them within their stall at a profit. They used group work to create their stall and organise items for sale.
